Wonford Planters

Local greening group, Wonford Planters, is progressing with its pocket park project adjacent to Wonford Green Surgery. With support from Exeter Connect, the group successfully applied for an Awards for All grant from the National Lottery. The grant includes events to engage the local community with the project. For this, they are utilising the skills of another great community enterprise, Wood for Good, (part of Co-Create). It's fantastic to see groups and projects collaborate to take action in their community and to bring neighbours together.

An Xmas-wood craft event will be held on Saturday 11th December from 10am to make bug hotels and bird boxes for the site and to take home. Co-Create will also be making the raised beds and bench for the park. Do pop along - a bird box or bug hotel would make a great Christmas gift!



Barriers to Bridges Magazine

One of our Development Workers has been supporting Dawn Saunders, the founder of the <u>Barriers to Bridges Magazine</u>. This is such a great initiative, and we wanted to give Dawn the chance to share a bit more.

"Hello, I am the founding editor for Barriers to Bridges Magazine – a new online publication, providing a platform for marginalised people and communities.

After embarking on, and completing my Master of Arts in Journalism as a mature student in Sheffield and relocating to Exeter, I launched Barriers to Bridges at the beginning of this year. As a marginalised woman, due to my visual impairment, single-parent status and having been homeless on two occasions, I am passionate in providing a 'voice for the voiceless' among the current level of noise and inequality.



We are currently working on our December issue and looking to secure funding through a stakeholder campaign, crowdfunding and other funding streams in the new year – not to mention acquiring CIC status, so we are ambitious and passionate about writing compelling copy."

"I have had the pleasure of working with Dawn Sanders over recent months on her journey to establish Barriers to Bridges. She is an amazing social entrepreneur, so full of passion based on her lived experience of experiencing barriers to social inclusion throughout her life. I have been supporting her with a range of development issues including grant application skills, stakeholder analysis and engagement and legal structures. Merry Go Round and Spinning Top Toy Libraries

Did you know that libraries don't always focus on book borrowing? There are some great initiatives across Exeter that are instead focused on sharing and borrowing equipment, activities, games, and more. These are a great way to make items more accessible, reduce consumption and waste, and to foster community spirit.

For example, the newly formed <u>Exeter Library of Things</u> has just run a very successful crowdfunding campaign, and will soon be lending out items, ranging from hand tools to a PA system!

Another local initiative is the Merry Go Round and Spinning Toy Top Libraries which lend toys and games for adults and children to enjoy together. The toy libraries are open not only for families, with children aged from a few months to early teens, but also for any groups or individuals involved in providing daycare for children.

They offer an online Covid-safe click and collect service and their toy librarians can also offer advice on which toys are most suitable for individual children, taking into account their age, stage and interests. Merry Go Round is open for collections every Tuesday 10am-4.30pm at Exeter Scrapstore and Spinning Top every Friday from 10am-1pm in the Beacon Centre.

FUNDING

The <u>Norman Family Charitable Trust</u> is running a second round of its COVID Fund and is inviting applications from charities and other non-profit/voluntary groups who have been adversely affected financially by COVID.

Application deadline: midday on 10th December 2021

The <u>Northbrook Community Trust</u> provides grants to charities changing the lives of some of the most disadvantaged young people in Devon. The charities they support typically focus on the care, education, and training of young people under 25.

The <u>Social Enterprise Support Fund</u> is offering grants of £10k-£100k. The fund will support social enterprises to rebuild; in particular, to help restart or grow your trading income, as well as to support your communities to recover from the COVID-19 crisis. They are also running a <u>free</u> <u>webinar</u> on Wednesday 8th December, 6pm for organisations to find out more about the fund and application process.

The first round of applications closes on 21st December 2021.

It was fantastic to see so many of you at our **Meet the Funders** event last month, and we hope that you found it helpful. Below is a summary of the funds that were covered during the session.

Devon County Council

<u>CrowdfundDevon</u>: Campaigns launching as part of CrowdfundDevon could be eligible for a contribution from DCC of up to 50% of their funding target (up to a maximum DCC contribution of £3,000). Constituted not-for-private-profit voluntary or community organisations (including town and parish councils) and charities can apply.

They are keen to support local projects that aim to make communities stronger, more connected, capable, active, safer, fairer and more inclusive; helping communities have more control to achieve the things that matter most to them, in the ways that they choose. Crowdfunding projects must raise 25% of their fundraising target and must also have contacted the appropriate ElectedMember/s about their project before being considered eligible for possible funding.

<u>Locality Budgets</u>: Each county councillor has £10,000 per year in grant funding. To find out more and apply, first <u>contact your local county councillor</u> and ask if they will support your project. Once you have gained their support, you can apply online.

<u>Covid-19 Outbreak Management Grant (Self-Isolation)</u>: Devon County Council is awarding grants to voluntary and community groups/organisations and social enterprises that help people by providing practical, social, and emotional support when they have to self-isolate due to COVID-19. Grants of up to £5,000 are available for small projects, and between £5,000 and £20,000 for larger projects. Groups don't need to have a bank account as long as another constituted organisation with a bank account can sponsor them.

FUNDING

<u>Covid Outbreak Management Fund</u>: This fund will support people who have been disproportionately impacted by Covid-19 including BAME communities, rough sleepers, those who are having to self-isolate, those who have been classed as Clinically Extremely Vulnerable, people with protected characteristics, people from deprived communities, people who are digitally excluded and people living in rural communities.

Funding available:

- Small grants scheme (max. £300).
- Large grants (£10,000-£25,000)
- Equality and Diversity Fund (£5,000-£20,000).

All grants will need to be spent by the end of March 2022.

Devon Community Foundation

<u>Thrive with 5</u>: Grants provide funding for projects and initiatives which improve the lives of individuals and communities across Devon. Applications of between £2,000 and £5,000 will be considered. Their current priorities are early years and the environment.

Application deadline: 23rd February 2022

<u>Devonian Grants</u>: Organisations may apply for funding of up to £5,000 to help people overcome or relieve physical mobility limitations. This may include equipment or specialised transport, such as accessible coaches or taxis.

<u>Community Grants</u>: These are designed to enable small, local, grassroots organisations across Devon to support, encourage and develop thriving communities. Applications of up to £2,000 will be considered.

Exeter City Council Grants Programme

<u>Ward Grants</u>: Community groups can apply for a maximum grant of £500. A Ward Grant can support a community project, a local community festival, a local theatre production or a craft group.

Exeter Small Grants Fund: The fund will support groups and organisations with a one-off grant of up to £3,000 to help run events, festivals and projects that aim to encourage community participation. This fund can also be used for a one-off purchase or repair of equipment.

FUNDING

The National Lottery Community Fund

<u>Awards for All</u>: The fund offers between £300 and £10,000 to voluntary or community organisations, and can be used to support your group with continuing to deliver activities or to adapt and become more resilient to respond to future challenges. Groups will need a constitution and a bank account to make an application.

Reaching Communities & Partnerships: This can fund individual organisations or partnerships, with grants from £10,001 or more. They are looking for projects that work to make positive changes in their community, and like to see projects that can test new approaches to issues in the community.

The National Lottery Heritage Fund

The <u>Heritage Fund</u> offers small (£3,000-£10,000), medium (£10,000-£250,000) and large (£250,000-£5m) grants. Their funding priorities are:

- Inclusion of under-represented groups: young people, disabled people, people with lived experience of racism, LGBT+ communities, people from lower socio-economic backgrounds
- Landscapes and nature
- Heritage at risk
- Community and local heritage

Exeter Connect is subscribed to various grant finder and search services, some of which are only available as a paid subscription. If you would like us to make a search on behalf of your group, please get in touch.

We can also provide support with grant applications, and read over any applications as a critical friend.

We are looking for volunteers who share our values of compassion and inclusivity to join a new team of listening volunteers.


