Let's Create Jubilee Fund



Grants of between £750 and £10,000 will be awarded to not-for-profit organisations to deliver creative and cultural events that engage local communities for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in early June 2022.

The fund has been created by Arts Council England (ACE) with funds from the National Lottery, and will provide an opportunity for community organisations to work collaboratively with artists and cultural organisations to produce creative events.

The public-facing event should take place in June or around the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Weekend (2nd-5th June 2022), but projects can begin from 1st April 2022.

Constituted voluntary and community organisations with charitable aims can apply.

Projects must engage with at least one of the following art forms supported by Arts Council England:

- Combines Arts, including carnivals and festivals.
- Dance.
- Library services.
- Literature.
- Museum services.
- Music.
- Theatre, and
- Visual Arts.

Grants can be used for:

- Artist fees (both creating and delivering the event).
- Costs of making your event accessible to all, such as BSL interpreters, translators, additional signage.
- Costs of organising events and people needed to manage the project.
- Food and non-alcoholic drinks.
- Marketing cost and promotion of the event.
- Materials or equipment needed for the activity.
- Overheads relating specifically to the project, such as insurances, and
- Volunteer expenses.

Applicants are encouraged to partner with an artist, creative or cultural organisation that has been in receipt of Art's Council England funding within the last four years to help to deliver the project. While this isn't an absolute requirement, awards of between £5,000 and £10,000 are only likely to be made where an applicant can evidence that an artistic partnership is in place.

Application deadline: Monday 28th February 2022

FUNDING

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Activity Fund

Grants of between £300 and £10,000 are also available through the <u>Queen's Platinum Jubilee Activity</u> <u>Fund</u> for projects which help inactive people get active, or less active people become more active.

In particular, they are looking for projects that support people who may have less opportunity to be active. Projects should also consider how they add value to their local community and work collaboratively with other groups to maximise their impact.

Only not-for-profit organisations, with a minimum of three unrelated/non-cohabiting, trustees or directors where decision-making/voting rights are equitably distributed, are eligible to receive funding under this fund. However, you do not need to be a sports organisation to apply.

Covid Outbreak Management Funding

Grant funding is available for voluntary and community organisations supporting the COVID-19 response in Devon over the winter months.

Devon County Council (DCC), Devon Voluntary Action (DeVA) and Devon Communities Together (DCT) are working in partnership with voluntary sector organisations to deliver a major programme of Covid Outbreak Management funding across Devon. This includes a Small Grants Scheme and COVID Management Large Grant Fund.

COVID-19 Small Grants Scheme

Grants of up to £300 are available for projects that are helping to mitigate the impacts of Covid-19 over the winter months. All funding must be spent by the end of March 2022.

The closing date for applications is 21st January 2022. Applications will then be assessed 28th January 2022.

COVID Management Large Grant Fund

Grants of £10,000 – £25,000 are also available for voluntary, community groups or social enterprises who are providing support for people over the winter in response to COVID-19.

Applications will be considered on a rolling basis. All funding must be spent by the end of March 2022.

Household Support Grants

Devon Community Foundation's Household Support Grant scheme provides funding of up to £10,000 to organisations working to alleviate food and fuel insecurity in the coming months. Grants can be used to alleviate immediate needs and help those who are struggling to afford food, energy and water bills, and other related essentials.

Application deadline: 15th March

FUNDING

Community Fridge Funding

Groups can apply for £4000 of funding to set up a community fridge. Eligible not-for-profit groups must not have set up a fridge already, be planning to set one up in the next 6 months, and then plan to run it for at least 3 years.

Groups must also have a bank account that the money can be paid into.

Application deadline: 1st February 2022

South West Water Neighbourhood Fund

The <u>South West Water Neighbourhood Fund</u> supports projects in Devon with a focus on nature & the environment, providing opportunities for learning & development, bringing communities together and supporting the upkeep of local neighbourhood centres and facilities.

Funding can be applied for through Action Funder - sign up, register your organisation and post a project you want funding for. Your project will automatically match with any funds you meet the criteria for (grant amount, location, focus area), and your project will remain live on the platform (ready to match with new funds) until you successfully win funding.

Female Assertive Outreach Support Worker – Spark Project x 2 (CoLab Exeter): CoLab Exeter Resilient Women is a trauma-responsive provision that supports women to build their capacity for change and aspirations for their future. They work to support women with a range of complex needs including homelessness, domestic and sexual violence and abuse, and lack of access to services.

The Spark Project Team will be working 'out of hours' during evenings and weekends on a rota basis developing relationships, offering brief interventions and navigating into local women's services.
