The latest meeting was a really interesting discussion with lots of ideas sparking as to how we can reach the widest possible group of people and the best way to do so. We were joined by Donna from <u>AbilityNet</u>, a pioneering UK charity which believes the power of digital technology should be available to everyone, regardless of ability or age, and we are looking forward to working with them to recruit and train a team of volunteer "digital buddies" (If you have some time to spare, are digitally competent and would like to help others in your community, we would love to hear from you.)

Food Network Meeting

Exeter Community Food Network which was established during the pandemic last month held their first inperson meeting at the Mint Methodist Church.

The aim of the Network is to increase collaboration and joint working between groups and organisations providing Community Food, to achieve positive change on behalf of people in Exeter who are in need of food and to reduce food poverty/insecurity. The event brought together groups from across the city for a focused discussion on current challenges and opportunities for working more closely together. This event was very well attended with representatives from a number of organisations including **FoodBank**, **Exeter Food Action**, **FoodCycle**, **St Katherine's Larder** and the **Salvation Army**. It was fantastic to have the opportunity to meet with these groups in person, and we are really looking forward to our ongoing involvement with this network.

Roles and Responsibilities of Charity Trustees & Management Committees

FUNDING

Western Power Distribution Community Matters Fund

WPD and Local Giving have teamed up and announced a £500,000 fund, focusing on providing help and support to grassroots community groups tackling holiday hunger when schools are closed and children often go hungry. Applications are encouraged from organisations delivering projects that offer both short-term interventions to stop holiday hunger and longer term support to help reduce food poverty. Devon Community Foundation - Thrive with Five grant

The purpose of this fund is to support community organisations to alleviate mobility in relation to disability or ill-health. It aims to help people overcome or relieve mobility limitations, such as contributing towards the cost of equipment that significantly improves the quality of individuals' lives. The deadline is 12 noon on 23 February 2023 but applications will be regularly reviewed up to this point. Woodland Trust - Free Trees for Schools and Communities

The Woodland Trust are giving away bundles of free trees to school and community groups across the UK to ensure that everyone has the chance to plant a tree and to help combat climate change. They are currently accepting applications for November delivery - you can find out more on their <u>website</u>.

UnLtd Social Enterprise Grants and Support

Grants and business support are available to social entrepreneurs that are looking to start or grow an existing social venture with up to £15,000 available for existing social enterprises and up to £5,000 for new social enterprises. UnLtd are committed to providing 50% of their awards to Black, Asian and minority ethnic social entrepreneurs, and/or disabled social entrepreneurs. FUNDING

OFCOM Community Radio funding

A total of £393,816 is available to help support the core costs of running licensed community radio stations. Grants can be awarded to support management, fundraising, admin, volunteer community outreach and organisation. Grants can only be made to community radio licensees in the UK, who are broadcasting under a community radio license. The deadline to apply is 5pm on Friday 10th June. The Enterprise Development Programme (Black and Minoritised Communities)

Grants of up to £30,000 together with additional capacity building support are available to enable not-for-profit agencies led by and working with Black and minoritised communities to move towards new trading models with the objective of helping them to become more financially resilient. Applicants may also have the ultimate aim of taking on social investment in the future.

This programme is limited to specific areas of the UK, one of which is the South West. **Applications close on 13 June** - it is a two step application process. More information can be found on the <u>Enterprise Development Programme website</u>

Exeter Community Energy (ECOE) Community Fund Grants

This fund is available for local community groups to apply for financing for projects that help to save energy and/or help to alleviate fuel poverty. ECOE provides the Community Fund to address the twin challenges of Climate Emergency and Social Justice. Proposed projects must have an energy or carbon reduction focus and demonstrate positive community impacts. The amount of the awards is not set in advance however it is likely that this year they will each be between £500 and £1,000 to enable several projects to receive substantial assistance. The Co-op Local Community Fund

A fund to benefit local communities centred around Co-op Food Stores and funeral homes across the UK or the Isle of Man. <u>The Co-op Local Community Fund</u> will fund projects that help local communities come together to help those in need by providing access to essentials such as food and community spaces; improving mental wellbeing; helping young people develop new skills and make a difference in their community; or protecting local biodiversity and tackling climate change. **The application deadline for this round has been extended to midnight on the 12th June 2022**.
